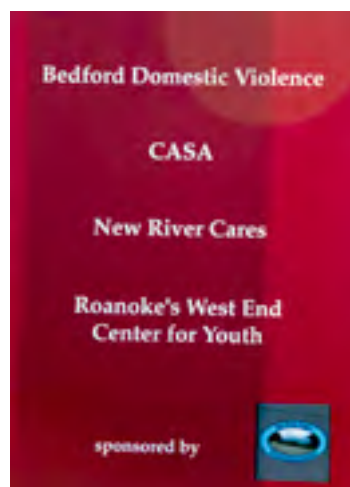
### Other Member Activities

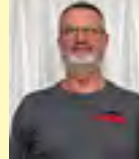

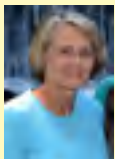
